ST. JEANNE ANTIDE, THE APOSTOLIC WOMAN



“The Sister of Charity is ready to go to the ends of the earth. When God calls and we answer Him, He gives us all that we need.” (Letters and Documents, SJA, Letter 2/28/1813). Witnesses called and sent on mission is the underpinning of the apostolic nature of Church (New Catechism of the Catholic Church, 857) and the life of St. Jeanne Antide. Hers was a story of an apostle par excellence. It had all of the apostolic dimensions that created a life lived for others, spurred on by a love of Jesus Christ in service of the poor and his Church. Her life was the unfolding of the journey of a true messenger of Jesus.

The premise on which the apostolic foundation of the Church is built is a deep personal relationship with Jesus Christ who was sent by the Father for the salvation of the world. In the writings and story of Jeanne Antide her knowledge of Jesus is continually evident. Jesus was the axis around which her life and ministry turned. It is easy to find proof of her love for Jesus and her tireless dedication to serving him through the poor. Jeanne Antide wrote, “To teach the poor to know, love and serve God is to do in part what the Savior of the world came to do on earth; it is to work to bring about the Kingdom of God. (Letters and Documents, SJA-P.D., p 151).

The events and actions of her life are a road map of a person **guided by the Spirit of God** in service of him. Reading her biography one is immediately struck by the searching Jeanne Antide went through. Her willingness to listen to the advise of others, to be sent in service of the poor was evident in the decisions she made as she remained faithful to her quest. Her openness to the situation at hand gave clarity to the ways in which her apostolic life evolved. Even though she was a fiercely independent woman, Jeanne Antide sought guidance in discerning where and to what God was calling her. The most obvious were the many instances in which Church or government authorities called upon her to address the specific needs of the poor. Her willingness to recognize the hand of God in these requests shaped and gave direction to the mission of the original sisters.

There are countless examples of the apostolic life of Jeanne Antide. Four highlights from her life serve as powerful examples. As her life unfolded and her understanding of her call to serve “God Alone” developed Jeanne Antide left the security of her home in Sancey, France to join the Daughters of Charity. Circumstances of the French Revolution forced her to return home to Sancey for a time. The drive to be faithful to her calling to love and serve Jesus Christ took Switzerland and Germany in the company Father Antoine Receveur and a religious group called the Solitaires. Jeanne Antide confided to her niece, Rosalie that she was seeking God’s will of that moment. The desire “to be sent” kept her in Sancey for a year and then set her on the road with Father Receveur. It was in that company that she for a time had pledged her life to the love of Jesus in the sick in the traveling hospital she was in charge of. (Rey-Mermet p. 106)

The ministry of Jeanne Antide and her early followers was often **in response to the needs of the poor** as Church authorities identified them. The prefect of Besancon, deeply troubled by the deplorable situation in the prison of Bellevaux sent Jeanne Antide and her sisters with the task of establishing some order there. Through the example and dedication of the sisters, a remarkable transformation took place. Herein lies yet another example of how she has answered the call to bring the gospel message of hope to the poor. It was in that same apostolic spirit that she sustained the call she received throughout her life.

Jeanne Antide's longing to go to the ends of the earth if necessary, to offer **her life in the service of Jesus Christ**, his Church and the poor spurred her on to respond to the call of Madame Letizia, Napoleon Bonaparte's mother to serve the poor in Naples, Italy. While the community she had founded continued to flourish in France, she like the apostles before her went out to bring the message of Jesus, to teach and to heal the poor in southern Italy.

*The details of the events in the life of this remarkable woman are recounted in her biographies. Another valuable source for more information are The Letters and Documents that contain her writings, the *Memoirs of Pure Truth*, Sr. Rosalie's manuscript (biography by her niece and secretary) and other correspondence. These resources shed further light on the events that serve as examples of the apostolic dimension of the life of Jeanne Antide.*

More than two hundred years later the Sisters of Charity of St. Jeanne Antide continue to serve in the apostolic spirit of Jeanne Antide. Hers is a story that transcends time and place. It touches our current days through the presence of a band of women who have followed her example and continue to carry on her mission of apostolic service to the poor. The Rule of Life of the Sisters of Charity of St. Jeanne Antide opens with the statement, "To love Christ Jesus, to love and serve the poor who are His members, to show them the love of the Father, this is the charisma and mission which St. Vincent de Paul and St. Jeanne Antide received from God." (RoL 1.1.1) The Sisters of Charity of St. Jeanne Antide Thouret today are present on four continents and in 27 countries throughout the world. They continue to be called and sent by the Church to serve the poor in today's world.

NEWS UPDATE AUGUST 2007

Teams of the Reception Centre Projects

Adult Education & Community Team Work:

- ✚ The group met to discuss its strategy and approach. Given that two of the three members indicated availability after July 2007, work could not start in earnest.

So far, the group has organised a Course on Self-Esteem for clients of the social worker.

- ✚ A meeting was recently held with a representative of the Employment Services Division of the ETC. The aim of the meeting was to determine how the St Jeanne Antide Foundation and the ETC could collaborate on the provision of training to vulnerable groups and those inactive from the labour market.

During the meeting, it was agreed that since the ETC itself already offers a wide range of training opportunities to those registering for work, the St Jeanne Antide Foundation would identify clients who are inactive and not registering for work and those who wish to improve their job prospects through upskilling training opportunities. St Jeanne Antide Foundation can identify groups of 5 to 10 persons to participate in Job Clubs that run for 13 weeks. These could be held at the Centre with an ETC remunerated experienced Job Club Leader.



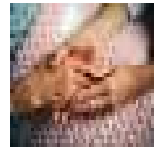
The Centre could tap into a number of ETC schemes, some of which will become operational next October. Once these schemes become operational, the Centre could engage scheme members remunerated by ETC for 20 weeks (20 hours a week) to undertake outreach work, research, maintenance work, data-imputing, interviewing, and other tasks that would enable the Centre to become more visible in the community.

Of course, for this to happen, we would require a highly efficient and competent mentor and supervisor.

Social Work Team:

- On Wednesday 1st August, Sr. Rose was invited by Appoġġ to a case conference at Mt. Carmel Hospital re services to be offered to a family who lives at Paola. They have involved our organization because it is a case in our area. This is an opportunity to work jointly with other organizations and also to make known our services in the community.
- On the 28th of June, Sr. Rose attended a one day seminar at SVDP on the subject of abused elderly. The subject was timely and pertinent because we have come across this problem in our area. During the seminar, this abuse was described as 'the silent crime' and the 'unspoken problem'. Seminars like these are a great asset and a source of ongoing formation to us all.



- There were no meetings of the social work group but supervision sessions between Sr. Rose and Andreana continued more or less once a week, excluding some days taken for holidays.

Administrator Reception Centre:

1. **Reception Centre Opening Hours** - During the month of August the Reception Centre was open on a regular basis for 2 hours in the morning and a further 2 hours in the afternoon every Monday, Wednesday and Friday for any person who felt the need for the services offered by the Centre's Social Workers. Once the word spreads around that the Centre is open for the public on a routine basis and at fixed hours, one hopes that in the near future those members of the public who feel they need to discuss their personal or family problems with someone, will be encouraged to just walk in and have their details taken for subsequent appointments with the Centre's Social workers.
2. **Training Course for the Centre's Staff** - During a meeting of the Foundation's Steering Committee on 20/07/07, the possibility was discussed and agreement reached on organising a basic training course aimed mainly at our members performing duties at the Centre's Reception Desk. This training course is to be organised with the assistance of Dr. Adrian Gellel from the Pastoral Training Programme of the Curia. Following a meeting between Sister Rose, Paul Barbara, Dr. Adrian Gellel and Mrs. Adreana Gellel on 6th August, a training programme on the lines indicated below was drawn up.

The course will be made up of four sessions, each of about 2 hours, to be spread over four weeks, that is, with one session per week over four consecutive weeks and it is proposed that the training sessions will take place between 17th September and 12th October 2007. Each session will commence late in the afternoon.

COURSE TRAINING TOPICS

Session I Personal Formation – vocation, evangelisation, Christian love and service.

Session II Knowledge and Attitudes – Charisma of the Order of the Sisters of Charity, scope of the Foundation, Services offered by other Church Institutes and NGO's. Commitment, care, non-paternalistic attitude, boundaries.

Session III Skills (1) – Welcoming attitude, referrals, basic computer skills, filling of forms.

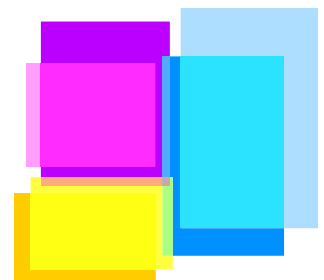
Session IV Skills (2) - Phone answering skills, inter-personal skills, dealing with emergencies.

A meeting for those interested in attending the above training sessions is being held on Tuesday 4th September at SJA Centre at 6.00 pm. The actual dates and time for each session will be decided following suggestions made at this meeting.

3. **Trace 99 Publication up-date** - The task of amending with the latest information the publication Trace 99 was undertaken by the Reception Staff. Up-dating is proceeding at a fairly good pace and hopefully most of the task will be complete by mid-September. Having such a publication with the latest information on the entities included could hardly be emphasised enough. This publication will be made available for accession in electronic format by Reception Staff as a reference index whenever they need to check for information on services offered by Church, Government or other non-Government organisations. The up-dated information on each entity will include addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail addresses and, where available, names of contact persons, as well as a short description of services offered by that particular entity.

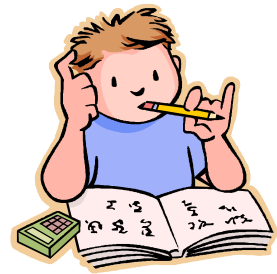
The availability of an up-dated version will prevent stale information, like old telephone numbers, or names of contact persons no longer with the relative entity from being given to members of the public. It will also enable staff to avoid unnecessary phone calls and loss of time in trying to contact entities with changed telephone lines or persons no longer involved with these entities.

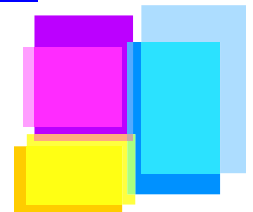

Procedure for New Volunteers:

4. The *recruitment contact person* sends electronic copies of the forms (which can be scanned as images) to Joanne, copied also to Tony Macelli and Sr Salvina
5. Paper forms will eventually be filed securely at the Reception Centre in the SJAF admin records with Paul Barbara
6. Joanne Ebejer will send the informative Welcome Pack to the new volunteer
7. Joanne will inform the Newsletter of any new persons being added to her database records.
8. What happens will vary depending on the new volunteer's needs and potentials and any expressed preferences in the Forms filled. There may in future be an interview.

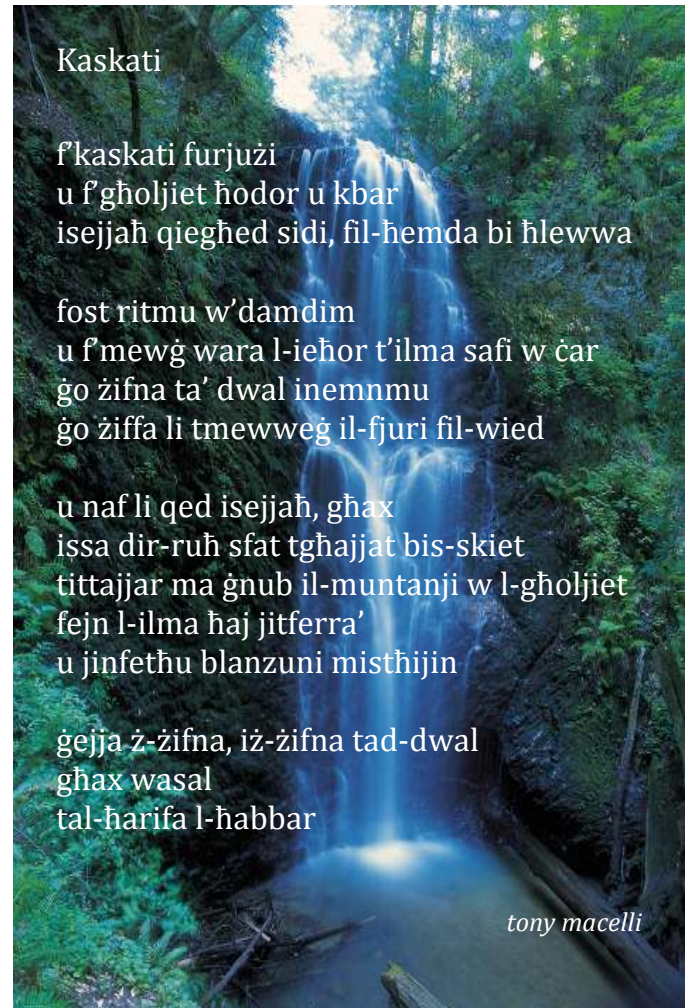


LOGO COMPETITION – closing date extended
