Gospel: (Matthew 5:1-12) Jesus went up the mountain, and he began to teach them saying, *“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.”*

Reflection: This solemnity of All Saints is a reminder and promise that through our baptism we already share in the glory of the saints whom we honor. The saints stand out as models that have been faithful to their baptismal commitment and give us courage and strength that we, too, can be faithful. We know some of the saints who have been canonized by name. And there are also countless other saints, our deceased relatives and friends among them, whom we also know by name. This multitude of faithful followers of Christ beckons us to hear what Jesus teaches in the gospel: “Blessed are you...” (Living Liturgy, p.240)

Vincentian Meditation: The Beatitudes are a new scale of values. We might say that the Beatitudes are an invasion of God’s madness into the world of what humanity considers being good sense. Have you ever tried to make a list of what you would consider your eight beatitudes? This could be very revealing and might show a very deep chasm between the values of our Lord and those by which we daily live. Do you feel comfortable with our Lord’s Beatitudes? Or has it been your experience, as it has been mine, that when you start to think or talk about one beatitude, you prefer to drop it because of its difficulty, and move on to another which you would consider more simple and easy? The beatitude that makes you feel most uncomfortable is probably the one that is most relevant to you personally. (McCullen, *Deep Down Things*, p.739)

The Homework club tutors met for a meeting on Wednesday 19th September, a meeting where our friendship, and team spirit, was once more evident.

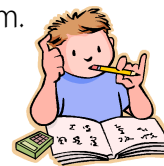

This time we are adopting a new form of record keeping, we have high hopes it will work and prove beneficial. Parents have been sent a letter of welcome and given a form to fill which will help our data keeping.

With the help of Mother Jeanne Antide, we hope and trust to have a fruitful year.

Friday 12th October 2007 - Today the Homework team started its first session for the Autumn Term. We welcomed a new member Graziella (an ex- pupil of the Immaculate Conception School). We learnt that Clinton, who was a team member last term, is not going to join our group this time. Tutors were shown the new text books, kindly donated to us by MS. Carmen Carabott. Mothers who accompanied their children got their registration forms duly filled.



Tutors were then assigned their children as follows:-

Richard is taking our oldest pupil Redeemer (Clint was his tutor last year), and it was a job persuading him to go to Richard, as he had bonded so well with Clint last term- at the end of the session he promised Richard that he would come again next Friday. We have to wait and see. Richard has also offered to be tutor to Simone, who is now in Form 1.

Melaine, Graziella and Clarie, took over the Year 5 group. Melaine, took two boys (the others have one each) but she is of the idea that Anton, would be better off on his own as he is quite a handful. Hopefully a person we have contacted will turn up and we can solve this problem.

Moira, Rita and Franca took up year 4, 3, 2 respectively (Franca has two children in her care).

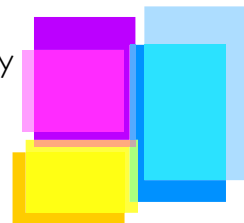
Session went on smoothly, mothers shared a word with the tutors after the session, and all had a word of thanks to our team members.

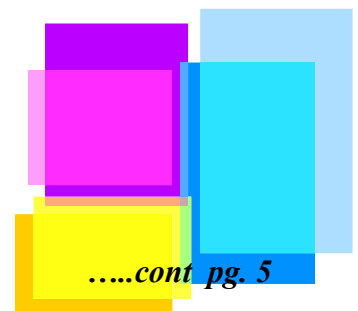
2. Training Sessions in basic Computer Skills

I wish to apologise to all members participating in the training programme for the cancellation at the last minute of the final session on Practical Skills which was due to be held on Monday 15th October. Mr. Mark Ferris, the lecturer involved, was unavoidably indisposed on that day and the session had to be cancelled at the very last minute. He extends his apologies to all concerned.

However Mr. Ferris wishes to make amends and he has graciously offered to deliver a number of sessions (instead of one) on basic computer skills. Attendance for these sessions will be divided into two groups: one group for beginners who have no or very scant knowledge on how to use computers and the other group for those members who already have basic knowledge on how to use computers but could do with some enhancement of skills. The Sessions will be delivered as follows:

1st Group: Enhancement of skills for those who already have basic computer knowledge:

- Monday 5th November - from 6.00 to 7.00 pm
- Monday 12th November - 6.00 to 7.00 pm
- Monday 19th November - 6.00 to 7.00 pm



2nd Group: Beginners

Monday 5th November - from 7.00 pm. to 8.00 pm
 Monday 12th November - 7.00 pm to 8.00 pm
 Monday 19th November - 7.00 pm to 8.00 pm
 Monday 26th November - 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm
 Monday 3rd December - 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm
 Monday 10th December - 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm.



In order for these sessions to have maximum effect I appeal to all those participants who were attending the Training Course to indicate by return email at the earliest possible in which group they wish to be included, depending on whether they consider themselves as beginners or whether they can already use the basic features of a computer. This will enable all participants to make the most of the training being offered as well as making for better delivery of the training sessions.

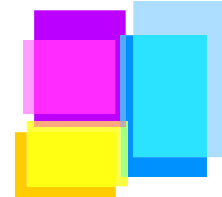

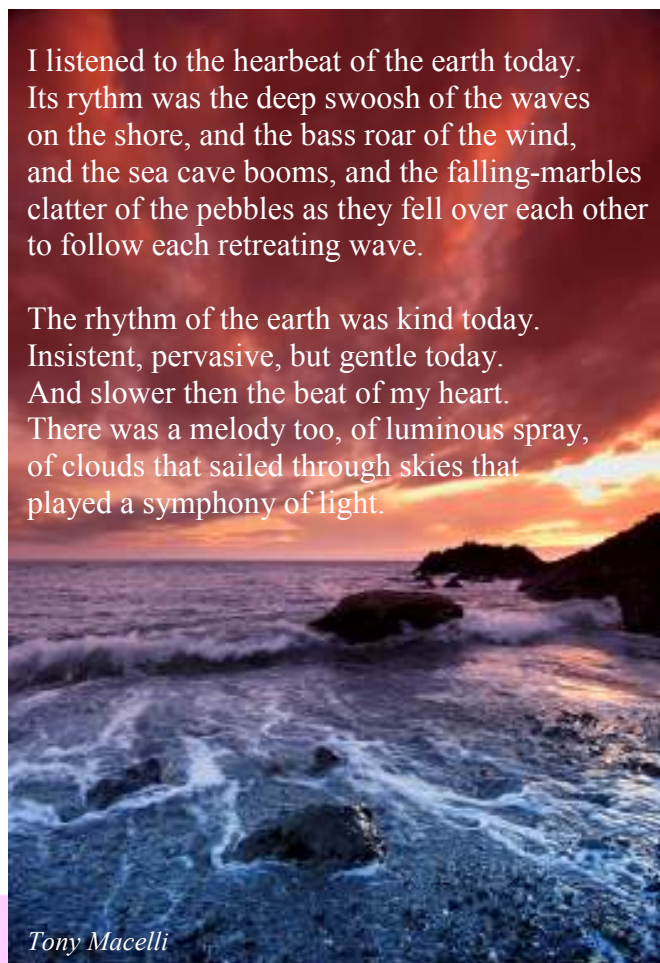
